According to official statistics...



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Ten thousand people live in a homeless shelter at any given time

Homeless services were almost 90% full on the night of February 3rd.



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The Third of February Homeless Survey is **NOT**

a census of all homeless people, **NOR**

is it a tool to estimate the number of homeless people.

The survey only covers **those people**, who are in touch with shelters or outreach teams at the given time.

On February 3rd 2013

64 % of the homeless people using night services in Budapest and 76 % of those using night services in the countryside decided to take part in the survey.

The surveys each third of February aim to provide a snapshot of the circumstances of those homeless on that day, and to follow changes throughout the years – in order to improve services.

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The number of respondents has increased in Budapest as well as the countryside, and also among those sleeping rough as compared to last year.



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On February 3rd 2013.

Ψ **75**% of the respondents in Budapest slept in a service Ψ **1057 individuals slept rough** and **3166 people slept in a homeless service** among the respondents in Budapest.


Ψ Only **64** % of the respondents in the countryside slept in a service

Ψ 2030 individuals slept rough and 3540 people slept in a homeless service among the respondents in the countryside



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Two-thirds of the respondent rough sleepers live in other cities





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While in Budapest the change in the number of respondents sleeping rough shows no pattern, there has been a steady increase of rough sleeping respondents in the countryside.

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For many years we have reached about the same number of rough sleeping respondents in Budapest (between 1000-1200 individuals) –with the exception of 2012.





In the countryside there has been a steady growth in the number of rough sleeping respondents – with the exception of 2012.

Why could this be?



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Why could this be?

On February 3rd 2012 the weather was unusually and suddenly very cold and snowy.

Many people used shelters to protect themselves from this severe weather.

Major steps of disaster recovery were put in effect.

Many people hid from police persecution, then in full force.

Outreach teams were overwhelmed by their normal routine due to the extreme cold and could not participate in the survey as much as in other years.

This winter outreach teams worked under more relaxed circumstances. New services have decided to participate in the countryside every year.

There has been a steady growth of rough sleeping respondents in the countryside.

In several settlements rough sleepers do not have the chance to sleep in a heated place even on the coldest nights!



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We are aware that during this coldest part of the year less people are sleeping rough than on warmer days.

Despite the cold on this single day about 3000 people spent the night without shelter (that we know of) in the country!



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Some more information about data collection:

Since 2008 the number of respondents using accommodation services has increased by 50% in Budapest, and has doubled in the countryside.

The number of participating settlements and services has increased significantly.

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From our data compiled through several years we know that

in the last five years at least 48 thousand people

had to spend some time sleeping rough or using an accommodation service

Homeless services challenged from all sides have provided help to at least 48 thousand individuals in crisis in the last five years

This also means that adding the children or other immediate family members these people have left behind in five years at least 100 thousand people became familiar with what it is like to be homeless in Hungary



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According to official statistics...

Hungary has the most expensive data registration system in the whole world,

The Central Electronic Registration about Service Users (KENYSZI)

collects data

from EVERY service provider in the field of social and child welfare

EVERY day

about EVERY service user

on a **daily basis**, through an **online system** monitored by a central state office (NRSZH)

Every day data of altogether 550 thousand

service-users are forwarded to this system, taking up a significant amount of the time of service providers, who register data instead of spending time with helping their users.



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According to official statistics...

The KENYSZI database shows that within one week

16 500 individuals used homeless services

7 500 individuals only used day centers and not accommodation services

They live elsewhere: either sleep rough or in substandard housing



















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There has been an increase in the number of people becoming homeless due to financial reasons or insecure housing

The rate of those with a permanent health condition or disability has reached 53 % among those living in Budapest and 47 % among those in the countryside in 2012

61 % of those sleeping in hostels in Budapest had a permanent health condition or disability

23% of homeless people have been called Roma at one point in their life



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We cannot forget that between February 2012 and February 2013

An unknown number of families have lost their homes due to eviction

Several tens of thousand families cannot feel safe in their home as they live in the shadow of **recuperation** due to some debt

A multiple of the number of those in the situation of homelessness on one night can experience homelessness throughout the 365 days of the year.

The 9793 homeless respondents on February 3rd 2013, among them 3087 rough sleepers are "only" the tip of the iceberg.

Many more people live without a secure home.



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Some questions from the 2013. survey – results to follow later:

- ✓When did you last live in normal housing?
- ✓ What was the cause of your becoming homeless?
- ✓ How much money did you have in January 2013?
- ✓ What does your permanent health problem or disability prevent you from doing?
- ✓ Have you received any penalty during the last year?
- √ How often do you consume alcohol?
- ✓ Has your income changed during the last 12 months?
- ✓ What do you think: is there going to be any time in the future when you will live in normal housing?
- ✓ What do you think: are you ever going to have legal, regular work?
- ✓ Have you ever been called Roma?



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The survey of the Third of February Working Group

has registered the life circumstances of several thousand homeless people every year in the last 15 years

it is an independent survey, based on the cooperation of various stake holders in the homeless provision system

when analyzed by professionals, it can provide guidelines for policy decisions, or analyze the effects of policy decisions

in these respects it is unique in Europe
